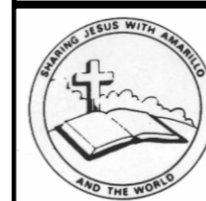

The following story took place around 1912 and was told to Maxie B. Boren by his father, J. D. Boren. It humorously contrasts one who took the mission of the Lord seriously with some who did not.

“IT REALLY HAPPENED”
