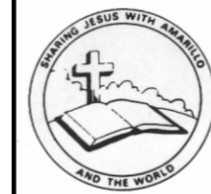

### THE WHINING

There is a tendency among most of us to complain. We complain about almost anything, almost all the time. The coffee is not hot enough, or it is too hot. The weather is too wet, cold, windy or hot. Our spouse doesn't cook the meals we want. Our team missed the playoffs again. Taxes are too high and government services are too little. The preacher preaches too long and is boring. Hearing our conversations, many could come to the conclusion that we must be extremely depressed.

After freeing Israel from slavery, God cared for them in the wilderness. For forty years God provided food and protection. But, during that time of extraordinary care, they complained about the food, the water, their leaders and just about everything else. Their complaining was so intense that God determined to destroy them all and start all over with Moses (Numbers 14:13-19).

We must learn from the mistakes of the past. Paul wanted the Corinthians to learn from the mistakes of Israel during their wilderness wanderings. *"Nor let us try the Lord, as some of them did, and were destroyed by the serpents. Nor grumble, as some of them did and were destroyed by the destroyer. Now these things happened to them as an example and they were written for our instruction, upon whom the ends of the ages have come"* (1 Corinthians 10:9-11).

Both happiness and sadness are choices. We decide to be happy or sad. For many of us it was not a conscious choice. But it was still a choice. If we made the wrong choice, we can change our decision. We can choose to be positive. We can choose to enjoy life. We can choose to give thanks for the coffee in our cup rather than complain about its temperature. We can choose to give thanks for the food we have instead of complain about the recipe used to prepare it.

As the children of God in fellowship with one another, we can choose to appreciate one another's strengths instead of complain about each other's failures. There will always be failures. Each one of us will always have personal problems. Each one of us also has talents and strengths. Each one of us is loved by the Lord. James writes that we should not whine about each other and bring judgment against ourselves. *"You too be patient, strengthen your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is near. Do not complain, brethren, against one another so that you yourselves may not be judged, behold, the Judge is standing right at the door"* (James 5:8-9).

Choose to be positive. Choose happiness. Choose the joy of the Lord.
