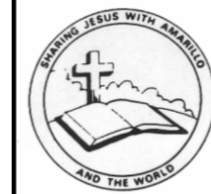

WHY ARE SOME OF OUR CHILDREN BEING LOST?

He was born into a Christian home, attended Bible class and worship from childhood, and was baptized into Christ at age twelve. His parents stressed the importance of the church, but he noticed they occasionally missed when tired from a hard day's work, when company came, or when they had some pressing business to attend to—so he concluded that the church wasn't really as important to them as they tried to make it seem. They also criticized the elders, the preacher, Bible class teachers, and others in the congregation, leading him to see all these people in a new light. These people he had looked up to were not really the kind of Christian leaders he had once thought.

As a teenager he wanted a car, but knew that he had to work for it—so he took a part-time job, working after school and on week-ends. Of course this caused him to miss the Wednesday night Bible classes most of the time, as well as many Sundays. It became hard to gain much from the Bible classes when he missed three or four for each one he attended, but he went when he wasn't working in order to keep his parents happy.

Some of his friends at work smoked and drank, and he was persuaded to try it in order to be "one of the guys." As he became more involved with these activities, he began to make excuses for missing worship even when he wasn't working. It was hard to realize that the church had once been so important to him! Now all his closest friends were those he had made outside the church.

One night he was out riding around with his friends, and they'd had a few beers. He flicked a cigarette out the window, and the wind blew hot ashes into his eyes. He swerved just as he approached a bridge abutment, which stopped the car instantly—the car he had given up Christ to own. Even though he had been wearing his seat belt, he and two of his new friends were killed.

The preacher had a hard time trying to comfort his family. It was not the time for placing blame and pointing fingers, but what is there to say about a nineteen-year-old who sold his soul for a part-time job, a used car, cigarettes, and beer? Ask his parents if he got a bargain. Or read Mark 8:36-37.
