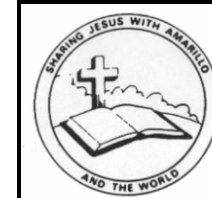

## PICKING THE WRONG FIGHT

I have to admit that I found a bit of humor in a somewhat unfortunate incident that happened recently. Under the cover of darkness, Somali pirates launched an attack on what they believed to be a cargo ship in order to steal what merchandise they could and, if true to recent form, take hostage any passengers and crew to be held for ransom. This has been a serious problem in the Indian Ocean recently. However, the ship these pirates attempted to storm turned out to be the 18,000-ton flagship of the French navy, the La Somme. Needless to say, it did not go well for the pirates.

Sometimes we too find ourselves in fights we ought not be in. We snap at the people who love us the most. We resist those who want nothing more than to help us. We create conflict with some who should actually be close allies. Certainly, the worst fight we will ever get into is a fight with our God.

The Bible reveals many who attempted to hold off God. Among the notables:

- Moses tried to turn down the call to Egypt (Exodus 3&4).
- Jonah refused to go to Nineveh (Jonah 1 & 2).
- Saul of Tarsus tried to eradicate Christianity (Acts 8:3).

If we venture beyond scripture, too many Christians actually stand in opposition to Christ.

To pick a fight with God is so utterly futile that we may wonder why any would attempt to do so. Yet, I would suggest, we do it quite frequently. Consider:

- We are told to tell others about Christ (Mark 16:15), but many refuse.
- We are told to help those who are in need (Galatians 6:10), yet some decline.
- We are told to assemble with the brethren (Hebrews 10:25), but an increasing number absolutely will not.

Brethren, these are not requests from our Lord. They aren't a wish-list of what He hopes we'll consider. These are among His commands of how His people ought to behave. To refuse is to pick a fight with Him. A fight with Him is a fight that you will never win.
