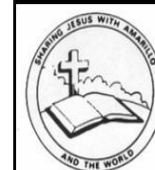

GOD NEEDS WOMEN

(Prov. 31:10) Who can find a virtuous woman? For her worth is far above rubies.

We need godly men leading the home and the church. Many social problems relate to the failure of men doing their job, but there is another side of the issue that must be broached. What about the role of women? We are often a society of extremes. There are those women who proclaim equality with men to the point of denouncing their roles as wife and mother. It is a fact that in God's sight a man and a woman are the same to Him. But in their earthly roles there are significant differences. God made man the head (1 Cor. 11:3) which results in submission (Eph. 5:22-23). When Paul related the responsibilities of older women, he instructed them *"To be reverent in behavior, not slanderers, not given to much wine, teachers of good things; that they admonish the young women to love their husbands, to love their children, to be discreet, chaste, homemakers, good, obedient to their own husbands, that the word of God may not be blasphemed"* (Titus 2:3-5). Okay ladies, this is what God expects of you. Any other pursuit is secondary to your responsibilities in the home. Any outside job, hobby, or activity must be pursued in the context of the woman's God-given role in the home. Working mothers have quite a challenge before them as homemakers, but many wonderful God-fearing women have successfully juggled career with the home and maintained an effective role as wife and mother. The other extreme is for ladies to assume that, in a subservient role, their talents are unnecessary in God's kingdom. Women are not given a worship leadership role, but God has given them many other opportunities to serve. Where would the kingdom be without the ladies like Dorcas (Acts 9:36), Lois and Eunice (2 Tim 1:5), Priscilla (Rom. 16:3), and Phoebe (Rom. 16:1)? Time and space will not allow us to examine all of the women that measured to God's standard of greatness. One cannot imagine the church without faithful women serving in the background. Consider Solomon's description of the virtuous woman in Proverbs 31. What an awesome commendation from the heavenly Father! (Prov. 31:29) *"Many daughters have done well, but you excel them all." Charm is deceitful and beauty is passing. But a woman who fears the Lord, she shall be praised."*
