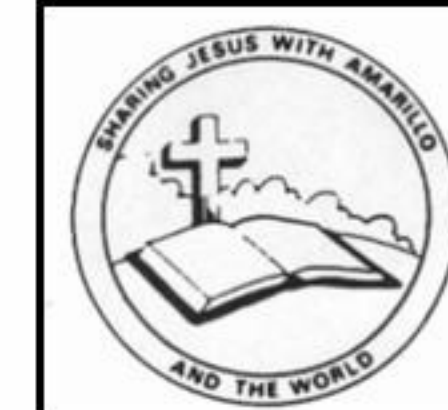

### A GREAT MAN WAS THERE

During his term in the White House, President Hoover gave the Declaration Day address one year at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. Accompanying him were his wife, a member of his Cabinet and several other Washington notables.

On the Sunday morning following, as they motored through the country, they stopped in front of a little church on one of the high Pennsylvania hills.

It was an ideal day for driving, and the farmers and the young people were either out on the highways or at home. It was summer again and the time for outdoor roaming.

Only thirteen came to the church building that morning. No special service had been announced. The regular preacher would deliver his sermon in the usual way. But those thirteen who attended and the man in the pulpit were happily surprised when the President of the United States and his party walked into the little building, sat with them during worship and made a generous contribution when the offering was taken.

What followed? Before nightfall, the news was carried throughout the entire community that the most distinguished guest in the country had been there. Many said, "If we had only known it, we would have been there."

But, every Lord's Day there is one who is greater than any president at the services. *"Where two or three are gathered together in His name..."* It is our privilege and joy to meet Him there (Matthew 18:20). Why will we make such effort to be in the presence of a great man and such little effort to be in the presence of the Son of God who is our Savior?

5. Hate poisons the soul. Do not cherish grudges. Avoid people who make you unhappy.
6. Don't hold postmortems; brooding over sorrows and mistakes.
7. Do what you can for those less fortunate than yourself; especially those who have blessed your life.
8. Keep busy. A busy person doesn't have time to be unhappy.
